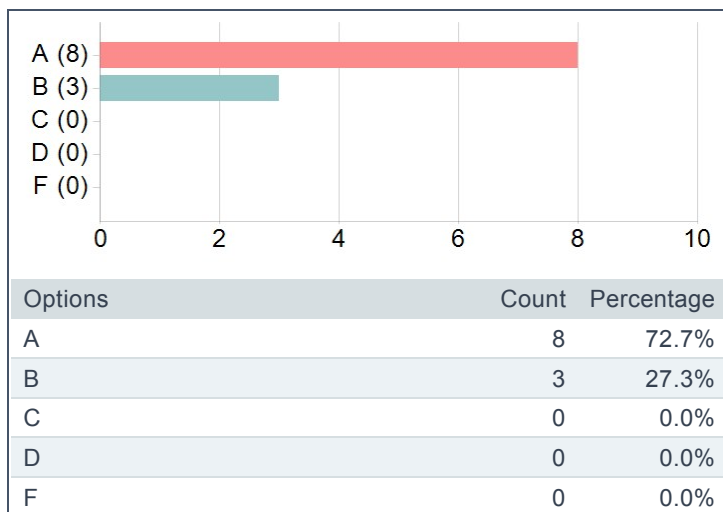
**What was your overall grade point average (GPA) at the beginning of the semester?**



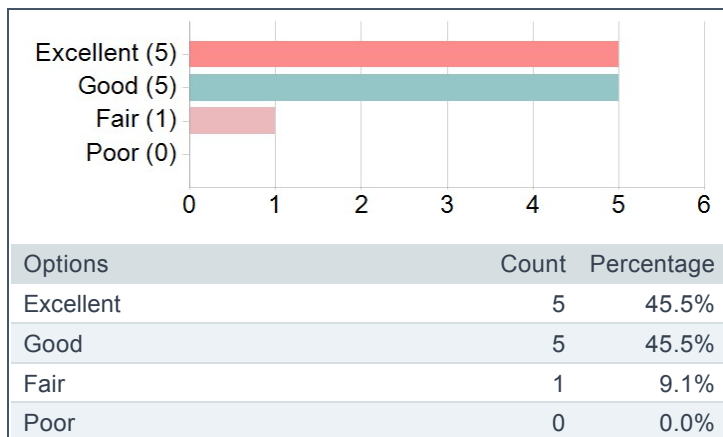

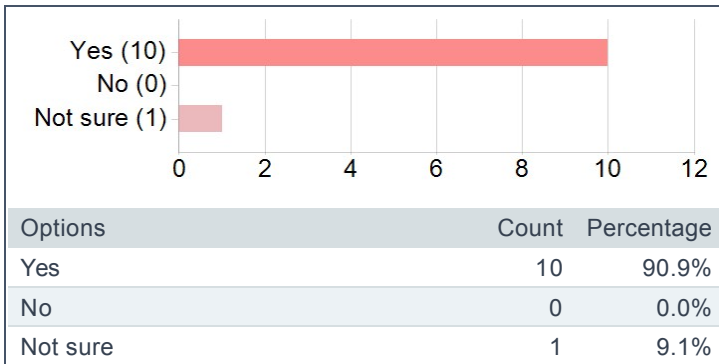

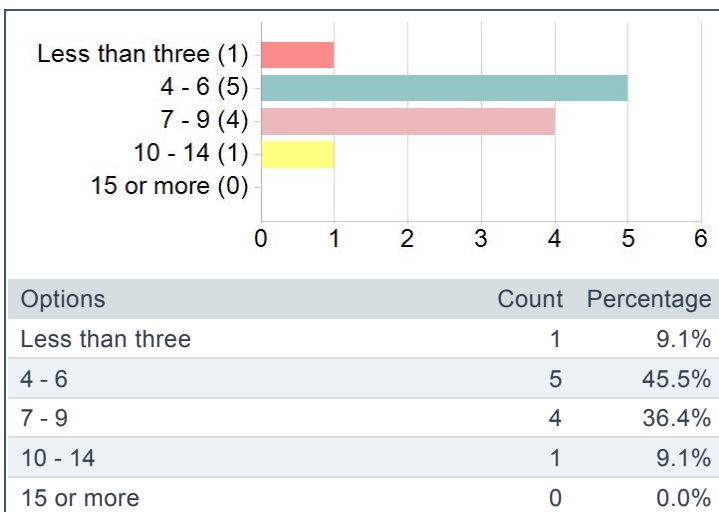

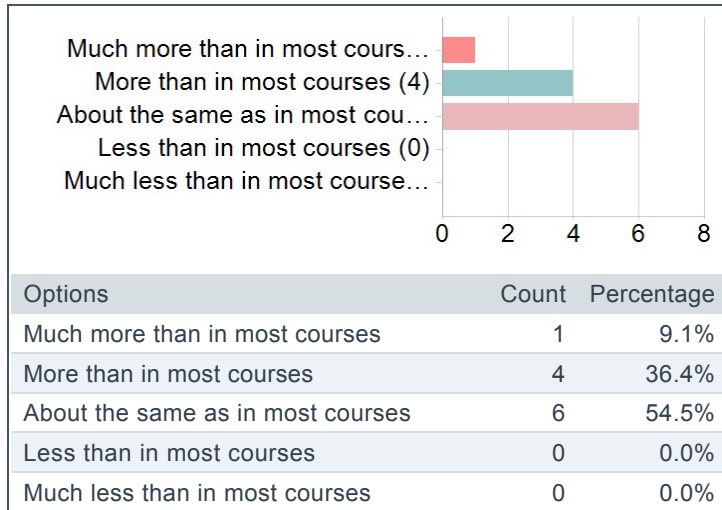

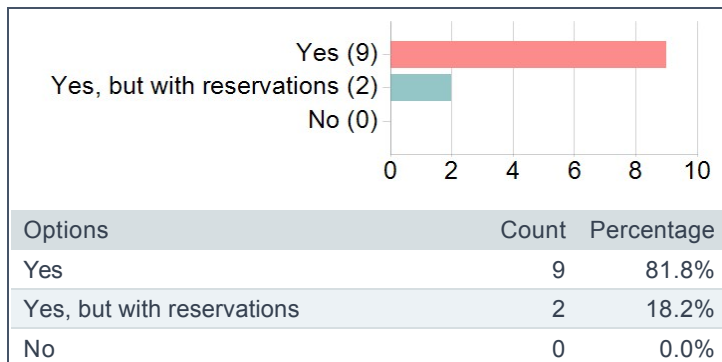

**Overall, the class was a lot more difficult than it needed to**

be. For a 100 level logic class, the amount of required work was completely unrealistic. On average there were 10 pages of homework per week that took multiple hours to do. Additionally, success in the course heavily relies on going to extra review sessions on Wednesdays. If I knew that ahead of time I would not have taken the class because my schedule doesn't allow to me attend those extra sessions. As an upperclassmen, I found this class harder than most of my 300 & 400 level classes.

**To improve the course I would suggest adjusting the homework to make it easier, shorter, and more realistic (often times the professor could not solve the problems in class because they were so difficult). Also, it is unfair to have "extra review sessions" every week without specifying it upfront in PAWS. I believe the professor had good intentions and was nice, but made the course way too difficult.**

**He was very perceptive of how the class was doing with the material and flexible with the pace of the course and amount of homework. He set up review time outside class and offered extra help to those students that needed it. His casual teaching style made him seem a bit more relatable than most teachers. He ran through a lot of examples and often tried various methods for figuring out a problem, which was helpful. He acknowledged and used his mistakes as teachable moments.**

**Before this class I had no idea what logic was. Now I realize how I can apply this to my studies within my major. This was definitely the most challenging class I took this semester, because I am not at all a "math" person, but the time spent in class, reviews and office hours really helped. It also shows that the instructor really cares about his students and wants them to actually learn the information, not just memorize it for an exam and then forget it afterwards. This class was not easy, but because of the instructor I am ending the semester with confidence and a satisfying feeling that I have accomplished learning a skill entirely new to me.**

1. I liked that the course helped me be more aware of environmental issues and their philosophical arguments
2. The course was fairly interesting and had an appropriate amount of work in my opinion. I thought on that that could have been better was greater focus on a few topics instead of a broad analysis of new topics each class.
3. I enjoyed the course! The topics covered were interesting. The instructor was good in terms of helping students to improve their writing. 1. The course was a work in progress but ultimately was very helpful to my writing & kept my interest throughout the semester. I enjoyed that professor as he was very flexible as well as helpful with my writing.
2. Overall, it was an interesting course and helpful as a writing course. The topics are related to real life and the reading materials were chosen carefully that they are challenging but not too hard. The instructor is patient and responsible, making sure everyone is on the right track

1. Yes, I do. There were many one on one conferences with the professor where we were able to dig deep & fix common mistakes in my writing.
2. Yes, the instructor gave very detailed comments and feedback for every paper and went through every one of them with me.
3. I think my writing has improved, but only for very specific essays/expectations. I'm not sure whether what I learned in this class will translate into writing for other classes.
4. Yes, I believe that my organization & flow improved within this class. This course promoted improvement by letting us edit our drafts. There are no aspects that should have been stressed more.
5. I think so! I feel like I have a better grasp of what an introductory paragraph should be like. There could have been more emphasis on how to conclude a paper and how to make an effective thesis.
6. Yes. I have never written persuasive or analytical essays using first person, subtitles, or anything but the standard five-paragraph format, so it was very valuable to write several essays in this manner.
7. Yes. The course taught me how to write both critiques and analyses in a professional manner. My writing became more simple and to the point.
